NHS England's General Practice Fellowship scheme is designed to support newly qualified GPNs (including those working less than full time) to transition from training to an employed member of the primary care team. The programme will help practices and PCNs to recruit and retain GPNs by offering attractive roles that lead to long term employment in practice, providing experience within a supportive environment.

The Greater Manchester Training Hub invite newly qualified nurses and employers to participate in the scheme.

Eligibility:

- Hold a substantive Salaried or Partner role
- Delivering GMS services
- Newly qualified or qualified within last 12 months

Fellowship Framework:

- 2 year programme
- CPD funding reimbursement of 1 session per week based on full time, 9 sessions (4hr 10min/52 weeks)

• **Phase 1:** Induction, Peer support, Supervision and coaching

• **Phase 2:** Learning and Development which includes:

Practice Management Learning

Quality Improvement

Remote consultation learning

Shadowing and integrated MDT opportunities

Supervision and coaching skills

Phase 3: Portfolio working; opportunities for experience and integrated working

All phases will be supported and in some cases delivered through the Training Hub

GM is also able to support nurses with the option to access a preceptorship programme upskilling and developing candidates to be General Practice Ready.
