IMPORTANT NEWS:

Non-Medical Education & Training Tariffs payments in 2021/22 – update from HEE

With effect from 1 April 2021, HEE is standardising the calculation of the Non-Medical Education & Training Tariff. The tariff will be paid as an hourly rate to address the current variation on placements weeks across the country and to bring transparency. This is not a cost reduction exercise, but it is necessary that we are making payments to placement providers consistently in line with tariff guidance and matching the funding provided by DHSC for tariff payments. In September 2020, most organisations will not see a decrease in their income. HEE remains committed to collaborating with NHS and education partners to support the future workforce and appreciates the efforts of all our partners in supporting the increasing intake of students.

<p>Professional Education and Development (PED) Course 2021</p>	<p>The course aims to help you achieve your goals and improve your life as you ride the roller-coaster of general practice. The course will motivate you and develop your resilience and leadership skills.</p> <p>PED is aimed at GPs in the Health Education England (HEE) North West area who have a regular (non-locum) position at a practice be it as a partner or salaried.</p> <p>Course Fees</p> <p>PED educational costs are supported by HEE and participants are asked to contribute £480 towards the course fees and £50.00 per night towards the residential costs (if they are held). There are additional fees for UCLan registration and for the optional leadership module</p> <p>Closing date for applications: 10th September 2021 with priority being given to early applicants.</p>	<p>The next PED course starts with a three-day residential 20 - 22nd October 2021. If this is not possible because of Covid there will be a two-day virtual module and an extra study day instead.</p> <p>Study days will be on 2nd December 2021, 27th January 2022 and 17th March 2022. The second residential module is planned for 22 - 24th June 2022.
