Starting on Friday 30th July Greater Manchester Training Hub, in conjunction with the GM Health and Social Care Partnership, are running a PA GP Ready Programme for both newly qualified and new to primary care physician associates working in general practice in Greater Manchester. The course will run for 1 year with half day morning tutorials delivered on Friday mornings. I have attached the planned schedule which details the course contents and planned teaching dates.

This fully funded programme is designed to give both newly qualified PAs and new to practice PAs the necessary skills and learning to fully embed them into working in general practice with tutorials on clinical topics such as cardiovascular disease, respiratory disease and diabetes as well as non-clinical topics such as quality improvement and leadership.

The programme is relevant for health and social care professionals involved in multidisciplinary stroke care.</p> <p>About the elearning programme</p> <p>The Stroke programme has been designed to provide all health and social care professionals and multidisciplinary teams with a factual level of knowledge they need to deliver effective stroke prevention and care to people with stroke, and at risk of stroke.</p> <p>The programme has been designed to deliver a Stroke-Specific Education Framework (SSEF) Level 2 of knowledge. It aims to inform the delivery of safe and effective care for those with, or at risk of, stroke.</p> <p>Learners will experience 2 elearning sessions and have access to an online toolkit of additional stroke educational resources. The elearning is free to access with any email address. Those with an NHS email address may wish to log in to record their learning activity.</p>

HEE National Education and Training Survey (NETS) Open please cascade across your organization

The HEE National Education and Training Survey (NETS) is open and will be available for four weeks for students and trainees to fill in.

The NETS is the only national survey open to all students and trainees undertaking a practice placement or training post as part of their education and training programme.

The survey asks learners to comment on their experience, asking them to provide feedback on what is working well and what could be improved.

It asks 32 questions, covering the main aspects of student experience in the placement learning environment, including induction, clinical supervision, facilities, learning opportunities and teamwork.

The NETS gathers feedback from students and trainees across healthcare services and the responses from the postgraduate medical trainees feed into reports, including HEE's improving junior doctors' lives report.
